# **Duke University**

Continued accreditation for the Forest Resource Management concentration degree program leading to the Master of Forestry, effective January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2032. Progress report required in 2023.

## **Oregon State University**

Continued accreditation for the Bachelor of Science in Forest Engineering, Bachelor of Science in Forest Engineering/Civil Engineering, and Bachelor of Science in Forestry degree programs, effective January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2032.

### **Stephen F. Austin State University**

Continued accreditation for the Bachelor of Science in Forestry program, effective January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2032. Progress report required in 2024.

### **University of Arkansas - Monticello**

Continued accreditation for the Bachelor of Science in Natural Resources Management, effective January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2032. Progress report required in 2024.

## **University of British Columbia**

Granted full accreditation for the Master of Sustainable Forest Management degree program, effective January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2032.

## University of Wisconsin – Stevens Point

Continued accreditation for the Bachelor of Science in Forestry degree program, effective January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2032.
